IL HARMONICA TRIO

Il Harmonica Trio is a group of diverse popular music composed of three prestigious Argentine musicians: Cristian "Crispy" Aguirre (chords, Harmonetta and chromatic harmonica): Lucas Chamorro (chromatic,



chords and diatonic harmonica); and Andrés Chorny (bass and chromatic harmonica).

Playing both covers and songs of their own, they include popular genres like Tango, Jazz, Waltz and others and perform in various places, for example bars, pubs, theaters, conventions and festivals. Moreover, the group makes a contribution to harmonica learners and the public in general by presenting talks, seminars, master classes and didactic concerts, spreading the interest in and acknowledgement of these kinds of formations.

The group has received several awards and recognitions for many audiovisual works. Among the most important ones, we could highlight a subsidy given by the National Music Institute (INAMU) which drove the trio to record their first studio album - Il harmonica I - and high-quality produced videoclips.

At present, besides performing live, "Il Harmonica Trio" works at varied cultural and educational spaces, encouraging their listeners to get interested in these sorts of formations. It inspires and spreads the orchestral use of the harmonica through talks, seminars, masterclasses and didactical concerts. This is not only in Argentina, but also worldwide, taking part in prestigious conventions and festivals, such as the SPAH Society Convention in The USA, where "Il Harmonica Trio" offered a didactic concert in August, 2021.

WILL WILDE



Will Wilde has taken the harmonica way beyond its blues roots since he first emerged on the music scene in 2010. Always pushing forward, evolving and redefining his sound, Wilde is now taking the rock world by storm with his band Bad Luck Friday. Wilde's hard-edged harmonica steals the spotlight from the traditional rock guitar, with a sound that owes as much to Slash or Gary Moore as it does to Sonny Boy Williamson or Little Walter.

James Conway is an Irish-American musician based in Chicago, Illinois, and is particularly known for playing traditional Irish music on the harmonica and tin whistle. He also plays guitar, bodhran, and plays folk and country blues music. Jason Ricci said of Conway's playing, "This guy is the king of tongue switching (playing out of both sides of your mouth) - his octave leaps, effortless complex melodies, and chords are mind melting to the



harmonica player while natural to the listener.

ROSEBUSH YOUTH SHOWCASE

Profile of 2023 SPAH William Rosebush Youth Fund Scholars Born in Jackson, Mississippi, 15-year-old Harrell "Young Rell" Davenport fell in love with the blues at a young age. Challenged by many struggles, he started learning guitar and harmonica at the age of 10 to express his anguish. Influenced by legends such as Jimmy Reed, Eddie Taylor and Billy Branch, Rell played his first concert at the age of 10, followed by writing his first song at 11.

Cale Fladager is a 16-year-old self-taught harmonica player and multi-instrumentalist originally from Saskatchewan, Canada, though he currently lives in Poland. He's only been playing harmonica for 1.5 years—jazz on the chromatic harmonica, and blues and folk on diatonic and tremolo harmonicas. Cale is currently playing and leading original jazz compositions for harmonica with various ensembles at European international school music festivals.

Aramis St-Gelais is a 21-year-old Canadian diatonic, chromatic, and harmonetta player who plays jazz, new music, and Classical pieces. He fell in love with the harmonica at age 15. Aramis studied jazz harmony and composition in high school and, upon graduation, was awarded Composer of the Year. While at University in New Brunswick, Canada, he became the first harmonicist in the jazz band. Aramis composes and arranges pieces and études for harmonica and mixed ensembles, including big bands.

Alexander Harris is an 11-year-old from Virginia who has been playing the harmonica for 6 years. He has been instructed by Dr. George Miklas. Alexander enjoys playing diatonic, 12, and 16 hole chromatic. His harmonica styles are Classical, traditional, patriotic, and folk.

Sally Ma is a 14-year-old harmonica talent based in Shanghai, China. She began to learn chromatic harmonica in kindergarten at age 5, and, starting at age 7, studied under harmonica virtuoso Zhao Chenxi, and is currently also a student of Mr. Gordon Lee (Harmonica World Champion). Sally won 1st Runner Up Chromatic Harmonica Solo in the 13th Asia Pacific Harmonica Festival Youth Group (2022), Gold Award in Taiwan Harmonica Music Competition in harmonica solo junior (2020), and Champion in China national harmonica competition Junior Group (2019). She opened her first harmonica solo concert in Shanghai in 2020 and has performed harmonica on live TV. Sally was a SPAH Youth Online Scholar in 2021 and 2022.


David Manche is a 20-year-old college student from Kentucky who is self-taught on the diatonic harmonica and enjoys playing country, bluegrass, and gospel. He has been playing for 5 years. The college band in which he plays recently came in 1st in a battle-of-the-bands competition.

JASON KEENE

Jason Keene is a Chromatic Harmonica player who resides in Los Angeles, California.

His main interest has always been West Coast Jazz, influenced by melodic players like Chet Baker, Gerry Mulligan, Stan Getz, and is also a huge fan of Nat "King" Cole and other great vocalists from the 1940's through the 1960's.

Jason is also interested in Electronic music, and hopes to expand the role of harmonica players in



contemporary styles via the MIDI Harmonica recently invented.

Jason has been blessed to study with many wonderful harmonica players, Wim Dijkgraaf, Laurent Maur, Ron Kalina and most recently Los Angeles Woodwind legend Terry Harrington.

He has performed on stage and/or recorded with many Los Angeles players of note: Dean Parks, Jim Cox, Larry Goldings, David Jackson, Geoff Pearlman, George Doering, Dillon O' Brian, and many others. He has toured the States and Europe extensively with the Kyle Gass Band.

With the invention of the Lekhoilm DM48 MIDI Harmonica, Jason has actively pursued the mastery of this amazing instrument as well, as it has opened up an entirely new world of options for harmonica players that wish to use electronic sounds like Synthesizers, and instrument modeling apps like SWAM Horns and more.

His preferred chromatic harmonica company is SEYDEL, and is proud to be an endorsee.

Multiple award winning jazz, funk and blues harmonica player, singer, songwriter Jason Ricci has played with, toured and recorded with some of the world's most esteemed blues, jazz, rock and New Orleans musical legends. Jason is included in nearly every top ten and top twenty lists of harmonica players in magazines and all over the internet. His fascinating career and life has led him up to the highest musical mountain tops such as performing at The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, recording a Grammy winning record with Johnny Winter, winning three Blues Music Awards and numerous nominations from The Blues Foundation only to fall all the way down to the lowest valleys of addiction, homelessness, jails and back up again. Today his sincere recordings, shows, songs and incendiary harmonica playing continue to tell the story of life and garner new fans to add to an emotionally devoted following of dedicated music lovers.

ROSEBUSH YOUTH SHOWCASE




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

CHRIS BAUER'S HARMONIKINGS







Combining the chromatic, chord, and bass harmonicas together creates the unique sound of the harmonica trio. Chris Bauer's Harmonikings features Chris Bauer on the chromatic, A.J. Windmeyer on the chord, and Boaz Kim on the bass.

Originally from Long Island NY and now a Connecticut resident, Chris has been playing harmonica for over 50 years and is influenced by Jerry Murad, Toots Thielemans, Pete Pedersen, Charley Leighton and many others. His father, Bob Bauer, was a legendary chord player and Chris grew up playing in his dad's trio, the Harmonikings. While Bob was playing with Jerry Murad's Harmonicats, Chris was called in to create and record harmony parts on the Cats "Magic" record. Chris was also lead player for the Harmonica Masters with Bud Boblink and Frank Warner.

AJ Windmeyer developed a love of the harmonica at an early age and has been around the SPAH scene for quite a few years, taking to the chord and harmonetta. Inspired by some of the great chord players including Al Smith, Al Fiore, and Manny Smith, along with some of the great harmonica trios including the Harmonicats, the Harmonikings, and the Stagg McMann Trio. He also is an ardent historian of harmonica ensembles and has an immense library of recordings that he curates onto his YouTube channel "The Harmonica Archivist."

Boaz Kim hails from the Philadelphia PA area and is not only a superb bass harmonica player, but is also extremely talented on many other harmonicas including diatonic, polyphonia, and chord, and is adept in all types of music including classical, jazz, and certainly the harmonica trio. He is in demand for studio work and other performances and is a superb harmonica technician and instructor.

Together, they bring a fresh sound to well-known harmonica trio tunes that is certain to entertain SPAH 2023!

WILL GALISON

You may not know you know Will Galison's music, but you do. You've heard his unique harmonica sound on the themes of Sesame Street, The Untouchables, Bagdad Café and hundreds of other movie scores, albums and commercials. Harmonica master, Toots Thielemans, called Will "The most original and individual of the new generation of harmonica players". While Will is indeed one of the top exponents of the jazz harmonica, his career as a



studio musician has allowed him to explore and embrace many other musical idioms, from rhythm and blues to classical concertos. That's why he has recorded and/or performed with stars as varied as Sting, Donald Fagen (Steely Dan), Tommy Emmanuel, Barbra Streisand, Carly Simon, Chaka Khan, Ruth Brown, Jaco Pastorius, the O'Jays and Peggy Lee.

Will has released numerous albums under his own name (on Verve, PolyGram and Aosis records) and recorded as co-leader with other major talents from around the world. He's also delighted audiences at Jazz festivals and clubs around the world, recently in Japan and India. At home in New York, he has performed at venues such as Carnegie Hall, Joe's Pub and The Blue Note.

Will's self-produced 2011 CD, Line Open features Galison as harmonica virtuoso, guitarist, composer, lyricist, singer and arranger. Together with some of New York's top musicians, Will produced an album spanning a wide musical and emotional range, yet unified by his sly wit, compassionate outlook and deeply rooted musicality.

In 2023, Will produced the album "Let Your Heart Lead the Way" with singer Marilyn Kleinberg, pianist John Dimartino, drummer Victor Lewis and bassist Noriko Ueda, with Will playing harmonica.

While in New York, Will hosts house concerts, featuring premiere jazz musicians. A recent concert was a duo with jazz piano master Kenny Werner, who said of Will: "Will has always been a superb player, but his playing just gets deeper and deeper. I've played with the master, [Toots Theilemans] and Will is right up there".

MADCAT'S C.A.R.MA. QUARTET



Grammy Award winner, Peter Madcat Ruth, has established an international reputation through his exhilarating, riveting virtuosity on the harmonica. His expertise on this instrument has amazed audiences world-wide. He is equally at home playing blues, folk music, jazz, country, or rock and roll. Performance Magazine refers to him as "A harmonica virtuoso who is rapidly approaching legend status."

Madcat's music has been evolving for over 60 years. It started in the Chicago area in the early 1960s, with Madcat playing folk/blues on guitar and harmonica. By the late 60s he had immersed himself in the Chicago Blues and was studying harmonica with Big Walter Horton. In the early 70s Madcat moved to Ann Arbor, Michigan where he was a key presence in two of Ann Arbor's finest progressive rock bands. By the mid 70s Madcat was touring the world with jazz pianist Dave Brubeck. In the 80s, Madcat went solo infusing the folk/blues tradition with elements of rock and jazz. In 1990, Madcat teamed up with guitarist/ singer Shari Kane to form the duo Madcat & Kane. For twenty-four years they toured nationally and internationally.

SATURDAY MORNING COUNTRY GOSPEL SHOW



How to play Sweet Georgia Brown on Guitar and Harmonica

Part 1 – The harmonica session will focus on first learning the melody (adapted for blues harmonica) and then learning to play the notes of the chords. As time permits, we will then focus on creating variations for the phrases of the melody using chord tones.

Part 2 - The guitar session will focus on using shell chords that are easy to grab.

This is a 90-minute session, so I will adapt the ratio of harmonica to guitar focus depending on who shows up and where they want to go. But everyone will leave with harmonica tab for the melody and basic arpeggios, as well as guitar chord diagrams for the comping chords. This is a is a great tune for blues harmonica players who want to explore jazz improvisation without using over-blows or over-draws. You will need:

- A diatonic harmonica in the key of A and the ability to play bent notes as melody notes in holes 1-6.
- A guitar and the ability to play cowboy chords and basic bar chords to follow along with part 2.

Improvisation & Creating Your Own Sound Naturally

Jason will explore some of the usable scales found on the diatonic harmonica and how to properly use them in context of interesting improvisation. This will set up to some usable scale exercises.
